LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

On our recent trip to Wengen, I had a moment of embarrassment due to my habit of daydreaming from time to time. I was returning to the ICS flat after locking up St Bernard's church. As I reached the first floor, I tried my key in the lock, but it didn't work. I assumed Helene, who was out visiting her family, had already returned. I turned the handle and walked inside while shouting 'Hello Helene' - Whoops! - the flat hallway looked different – this was not our flat! A bemused German guy stood looking at me while I tried to explain in English what had happened.



'I don't understand English', came the reply. Red-faced, I tried, in my best German, to explain what an idiot I had been due to my absent mindedness – our flat was on the second floor! Entering through the right door was so important if I was to arrive at our Wengen home!

In John's Gospel, Jesus teaches us that he is the door by which we must enter if we are to arrive at our eternal home. "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved." There is no other way into God's house.

As we enter March, we are in the season of spring lambs. Many will be born at this time. Lambs need a shepherd to care for them and look after them. In the same teaching in John's Gospel, Jesus explains that he is also the 'Good Shepherd' who cares for his sheep and the way that he saves them is by laying down his life for them. In a way that only God can do, the shepherd becomes a lamb himself and dies upon the cross to save us.

I often think at this time of year of the piece I used to sing as a choir boy:

All in the April evening April airs were abroad; The sheep with their little lambs Passed me by on the road. Upon the hill-top green, Only a cross of shame Two stark crosses between. All in the April evening, April airs were abroad; I saw the sheep with their lambs, And thought on the Lamb of God.

Lent Prayers and Reflections

Set free from fear.

Read: Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war rise up against me, yet will I be confident. (Psalm 27.3)

Ask: Are you running away from your fears? Are you ready instead to face them, in God's strength?

Pray: Loving God, I thank you that in the turmoil of life, you are always with me – your love reaching out, your hand supporting me and your grace giving me strength. Help me to receive the freedom you offer, which comes from knowing you hold all things in your hands and that nothing can finally separate me from your love.

Faith in action

Read: Some may argue, 'you have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith without works, and I will show you my faith by my works. (James 2: 18)

Ask: What does your life say to others? Is it an expression or a denial of your faith.

Pray: Lord Jesus, teach me through the care I offer, the love I share and the service I give to express my commitment to you.

A pause for thought.

Read: Martha was preoccupied with her many tasks; so, she came to him and asked, Lord, doesn't it matter to you that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her to lend a hand. But the Lord answered her, Martha, Martha, you are fretting and distracted by many things; only one thing is really important. Mary has chosen that more important thing, and it will not be taken away from her. (Luke 10.40-42)

Ask: Do you succeed in making time for quiet reflection, or are such moments crowded out by the demands and concerns of daily life?

Pray: Loving God, draw near to me now in these few moments of quietness. Teach me to be still and to know your presence, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The gift of hope

Read: My soul waits quietly for God; my confidence comes from him. He, and he alone, is my rock, my deliverance, and my stronghold; nothing will shake me. (Psalm 62: 5-6)

Ask: Does the thought of the future fill you with dread? Do you feel able to leave your ultimate destiny in the hands of God, confident that, whatever you may face, he will finally make all things work together for good?

Pray: Lord, you have promised that nothing in heaven or on earth will finally overcome your purpose. Speak to me now through the faith and vision of those who have gone before. Send me back into the world renewed in hope and restored in faith, to live and work for you.

The call to conserve

Read: The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world and all those who live in it. In his hand are the innermost parts of the earth, and the mountain peaks belong to him. The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands shaped the dry land. (Psalm 24:1; 95:4)

The call to conserve continued.....

Ask: Have you altered your lifestyle to cut out unnecessary waste and pollution? Should you be adding your voice to calls for international action on issues as global warming.

Pray: Sovereign God, teach me to live wisely and responsibly, in harmony with you and all you have made, through Jesus Christ my Lord. Revd. Sue

Lectio divina is an ancient spiritual practice – a prayerful way of reading the Bible that allows for God to speak to us through scripture in powerful ways.


The Lectio Course is a 5-part series where Pete Greig, from 24-7 Prayer, will help us to explore lectio divina and use it as a tool in our life of prayer.

Thank you to all those who came along for the Big Churchyard Birdwatch at the end of January. We saw 20 species of bird in the first hour, and 18 in the second. Also, we had quite a few visitors enjoying Steve's delicious soup, and the cakes and hot drinks kindly provided by the Group. The results have been sent to the RSPB. All help illustrate which birds are doing okay and which are in decline – we did not see a greenfinch, for instance.

The churchyard is starting to look rather spring-like with snowdrops out and wild daffodils starting to bud. There may be a work party to prepare for some new trees being planted along the boundary. NATURE NOTES FROM HEMBLINGTON CHURCH FEBRUARY 2023

In last month's introductory article, I mentioned that, as part of our commitment to care for and protect our world, Hemblington Church had registered to become an Eco-Church and was currently working towards bronze, then hopefully, silver accreditation. Well, I can share the good news that we have now achieved our bronze accreditation! Particular thanks are due to Stuart Moore, who led on our application, and Sue Rowe and the Friends of Hemblington Church (FOHC) who have provided so much support.

The Eco-Church initiative is a nationwide scheme supported by, amongst others, The Church of England and Christian Aid. It works by Churches completing an online Eco Survey on how we are caring for the earth within 5 key areas of Church life:

- Worship and teaching
- Management of church buildings
- Management of church land
- Community and global engagement
- Lifestyle

Points are awarded for actions in each category which eventually lead to the bronze, silver and gold awards.

Actions are not limited to activities around nature and wildlife, they include things we can all do; for instance, changing to a green energy supplier or buying Fairtrade tea and coffee.

If you are interested in what we are doing and want to know more, please let us know. One thing we would love to come out of this is that it encourages everyone to think about what changes – large or small - they can make to help save our wonderful planet.

I also mentioned in last month's article about the annual Big Churchyard Birdwatch at Hemblington on 28th January. Organised by the FOHC and Sue Rowe reported the following:

Between 11am – 12noon, 20 varieties of birds were spotted in, over and around the churchyard; between 12noon and 1pm, 18 varieties were recorded. As important were the 21 visitors supporting the birdwatching and enjoying the refreshments offered by our 7 volunteers. Visitors appreciated the welcoming atmosphere, commenting on the lovely situation of the church, agreeing the birdwatch was a good community initiative, and certainly enjoying the excellent soups, scones and cakes too!

We will be planting some replacement trees at Hemblington Church later this month. (More on that in the next Nature Notes).
